Pavilion Conditions and Information

- Pavilion will open for entry submission.
 - Tuesday 28th May 12 pm – 4 pm
 - Wednesday 29th May 9 am – 6 pm
 - Thursday 30th May 7:30 am – 6 pm
- Pavilion will be open to the public at the following times:
 - Friday 31st May from 10 am to 7 pm
 - Saturday 1st June from 9 am to 2 pm
- Pavilion will open for Entry Collections.
 - Saturday 1st June 3 pm – 5 pm
 - Monday 3rd June 12 pm – 5 pm.
- Only the Pavilion Committee, Stewards and Judges will be allowed access during judging times.
- All exhibits must be accompanied by a completed entry form and payment, or exhibits will not be accepted. **Half-price** entry fees are for exhibits by **members** only. Extra entry forms are available from the Springsure Library and Mitre 10 or downloaded from our website www.springsureshow.com.au.
- No entries will be taken after the closing date and time.
- Exhibitors are requested to vacate the Pavilion after submitting their entries.
- All exhibits/entries throughout the Section must be the bona fide work of the Exhibitor. Work is to be original and/or adaptation of a copy.
- An article that has been exhibited at a previous Springsure Show shall not be eligible unless otherwise stated. Spoiled work will not be accepted.
- The Committee will exercise every care with work submitted, but will not be responsible for the loss of, or damage to, any exhibit while in its custody, or for the insurance of exhibits either in transit or while on exhibition. All transport and insurance arrangements are to be made by the Exhibitor.
- Full prize money will not be awarded if the number of entries in each class is less than three. However, the Judge's decision may be exercised regarding prize monies on work of a high standard with fewer numbers of entries.
- The decision of the Judges is final, and no correspondence will be entered into.
- Third place cards to be awarded in the Children's Section only.
- All competitors and exhibitors must pay the gate fee on arrival unless a Member of the Society or Judge produces their ticket or pass. Those people leaving the Grounds before 10 am Friday will be refunded their gate fee on presentation of the ticket at the gate. Those eligible for other refunds may apply to the Chief Steward for the Section, or Secretary's Office for refund.
- A Novice may enter the Novice Section for a second year as a Novice after having won the most points award with previous entries unless a First Prize in an Open competition in that section has been won.
- In Children's classes, work **MUST** be the bona fide work of the child.
- Points Scoring – **Champion 3 points; First 3 points; Second 2 points.**

- If an Exhibitor wishes to sell their entry/entries, please indicate to the Steward of that section at the time of LODGING entry/entries. Exhibitor to be present in Pavilion at 3 pm on Saturday 3rd May. Any item sold from the Pavilion is subject to a 10% commission donated to the Society.
- Trophies may be collected from the Pavilion at **3 pm on Saturday 1st June**. *If Pavilion prize money is unclaimed the amount will be deemed a donation to the Society.*
- No exhibit may be removed until after 3 pm. No responsibility will be taken for any entry/entries after the close of the Show. Exhibits not collected, and which are to be returned, should have clearly outlined instructions attached to the entry ticket of the exhibit, and **MUST** be accompanied by return postage.
- **Prize money**

3. Each print must be individually mounted on black or white lightweight cardboard, at **least 2cm larger than the print**, good prints are often overlooked due to bad presentation.
4. Limit of 4 photos per class per exhibitor.
5. Prints are to be no larger than 20cm x 25cm (8" x 10") unmounted.
6. Captions or Names on print mountings are permitted.
7. Exposure must be the work of the competitor.
8. **There is to be no major digital editing of photographs except in the creative editing class.**
9. No exhibit will be eligible to compete in more than one class or section.
10. No exhibit which has been exhibited previously at a Springsure P & A Society Show will be eligible.
11. The novice section is restricted to those never having won a "Most Points" award.

- 🍂 1 Kg Mixed Fruit
- 🍂 2 Cups sugar
- 🍂 150 g butter or margarine
- 🍂 2 tbsp. golden syrup
- 🍂 cups cold water
- 🍂 1.5 tsp bicarb
- 🍂 Bring all of the above to boil and simmer gently for 5 minutes. Allow to cool.
- 🍂 3 eggs lightly beaten
- 🍂 1.5 cups cold mashed pumpkin
- 🍂 1.5 cups SR Flour
- 🍂 1.5 cups PI Flour.

To cooled fruit mixture, add lightly beaten eggs and mashed pumpkin. Beat until smooth and then add sifted flours, combine well.

Bake in a well-lined tin for 1.5 to 2 hours. Test the centre of the cake by pressing lightly or by inserting a skewer. The cake starts to leave the sides of the tin when cooked.
